




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Letter from the President

The 39th annual Texas Flute Festival will be held Thursday, May 19, 2016 – Saturday, May 21st, 2016 at Texas Woman's University in Denton, Texas. The festival will feature guest artists Gary Schocker, Nina Perlove, and last year's Myrna Brown Competition winner, Isabel Lepanto Gleicher. Needless to say, we are very excited to be showcasing such incomparable talent, innovation, and mastery. Each artist will bring invaluable wisdom regarding their individual areas of expertise. Gary, a prolific composer, will perform works from his extensive discography, in addition to providing the unaccompanied solo "Prestidigitation, or Poof!" for the Myrna Brown Competition finals. Nina will be performing some of the flute standards, varying in contrast and color. Finally, Isabel Lepanto Gleicher, a creative force all her own, will be performing the latest in progressive, contemporary flute music. We will also get to enjoy Isabel with the Texas Flute Society showcase flute choir, featuring some of the best flute players that our local flute choirs have to offer. Add to this the masterclasses, recitals, flute choirs, lobby concerts, and numerous exhibits available at the festival, and you have every reason to attend! There is something at this year's festival for flute players of all ages and abilities.


I very much look forward to seeing you, and getting your feedback at the festival. See you there!

Guest Artists

We are so fortunate to live in an area that has such an active arts scene. Teeming with talented flutists, the Metroplex has an abundance of recitals, masterclasses, and workshops available. The Flute Festival not only brings together flutists in our area, but it also opens our eyes to the rest of the flute world. This year's Guest Artists depict a wide array of backgrounds, styles, and ideas. Everyone, regardless of age and ability, will benefit from attending events featuring the Guest Artists.



Gary Schocker is an accomplished musician of outstanding versatility. At age 15, he made his professional debut when he performed as soloist with the New York Philharmonic and the Philadelphia Orchestra. He has won numerous competitions including the Young Concert Artists, the National Flute Association, the NY Flute Club and the East-West Artists. Often, he concertizes in duo with guitarist Jason Vieaux. Internationally, he has toured and taught in Colombia, Panama, Canada, Australia, Taiwan, Japan, Germany, France and Italy. Schocker has composed

sonatas and chamber music for most instruments of the orchestra. He has also written several musicals, including "Far from the Madding Crowd" and "The Awakening", which can be heard on Original Cast Recordings. Both shows were winners of the Global Search for New Musicals in the UK and were performed in Cardiff and at the Edinburgh Festival, as well as in New Zealand. In New York, they were winners of the ASCAP music theatre awards. Schocker has won the International Clarinet Association's annual composition competition twice and the National Flute Association's annual Newly Published Music Award numerous times. Among artists who have played his compositions, James Galway gave the American premiere of "Green Places" with the New Jersey Symphony. In 2008 Schocker was commissioned to write the required piece "Biwako Wind" for the International Flute Competition in Biwako, Japan for which he also served as judge. Gary has private flute studios in NYC and Easton, PA where he dually resides.

First Prize Winner in the Laurence Beauregard Competition and winner of the 2009 YouTube Symphony Competition, Dr. Nina Perlove is one of the most listened to classical flutists of her generation with over 7 million views to her online video performances and tutorials worldwide. Reviewers have called her "a worldwide phenomenon," and she has been featured on the Oprah Winfrey Show, and in the Wall Street

Journal, Washington Post and other major media. Her groundbreaking website, REALFLUTEproject.com, has earned a loyal following and combines her dynamic video performances and teaching with musical commentary and research. She has performed throughout the United States and Europe, including appearances in France, Germany, Italy, Spain, and Austria and has extensive performance experience in both traditional and contemporary solo and chamber music. In addition to her flute performing and teaching, Perlove "is a fine writer, music critic, and advocate for modern music" (J. Pritchard, The Flute Network). Her articles have appeared in publications including Perspectives of New Music, American Music, Pan Magazine, Windplayer Magazine, Flute Talk Magazine, CMA Matters, and The Flutist Quarterly. Perlove was named "One of Twenty Professional Women to Watch in 2012" by the Cincinnati Enquirer and was the 2009 Honoree by Leading Women Cincinnati in Arts and Entertainment and is an Artist for Gemeinhardt Flutes.

Flutist Isabel Lepanto Gleicher is a compelling and versatile musician, performing internationally. Most notably, Isabel has appeared in Carnegie's Zankel and Weill Recital Hall, and Symphony Space in the United States, The National Centre for the Performing Arts in Beijing, China, the National Theater and Concert Hall in Taipei, Taiwan, Fukuoka Symphony Hall and Tokyo

Suntory Hall in Japan, as well as the Rolston Recital Hall at the Banff Center in Canada. In 2015 Isabel won first prize at the Myrna Brown Young Artist Competition at the Texas Flute Festival. Isabel is a member of new music sinfonietta Ensemble Échappé, an ensemble dedicated to performing a spectrum of 20th and 21st century music that is undefined by genre of style. She is a founding member of woodwind quintet Xylem, and has won fellowship positions at the Norfolk Chamber Music Festival and the Imani Winds Chamber Music Festival. Isabel is principal flute of the New York Symphonic Ensemble. She was a member of the Banff Festival Orchestra, as well as Principal Flute with the Yale Philharmonia.

Meet the Composer

With Gary Schocker Friday, May 20, 2016, 7:00 PM Margo Jones Performance Hall

We were lucky enough to have Gary Schocker compose the unaccompanied work for the Myrna Brown Competition finals for the 2016 Texas Flute Festival. Gary has composed works for piano and flute. He shared the following insight in regard to where his inspiration comes from: "Usually I get an idea about something; that is a melodic fragment. Typically, I dismiss it and once that has happened I encourage myself to respect my idea enough to just see where it might go... Many pieces come from commissions, those are easy to write. I also write a lot for the harp now, and that is usually my walking by and randomly plucking something, then seeing where it might go." Gary

expressed that he was very excited to "write something for my fellow flutters in Texas."
